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Outreach hubs

Why have we introduced outreach hubs as an element of phase two?

- More flexibility and freedom to use NCOP funding in different local areas
- Enables signposting and engagement with schools not covered by targeted NCOP outreach
- Provides opportunities to build or enhance local & regional collaborations with other stakeholders
- Encourages and enables sustainable networks and resources to be created for local outreach provision and collaborations to be developed and enhanced for the future

Outreach hubs: broad expectations

- Not a 'one size fits all' model so partnerships will want to consider how they deliver this work locally
- Sensible balancing of allocation for targeted outreach and outreach hubs
- Three elements of outreach hubs:
